Smile Survey Supply List

Please order all your screening supplies using the Screening Supply Ordering Form.

Personal Supplies for Screener & Scribe:

1. Government Issued Photo ID (such as a Driver's License) and/or proof of Covid Vaccination may be necessary at some schools as part of their routine visitor check-in process at the school office.

Dental Supplies:

- 1. Recommended PPE:
 - a. Long sleeve scrubs
 - b. Gloves Consider sizing up a glove size to make glove changes quicker between children.
 - c. Mask The same mask can be worn throughout the screenings. Change at breaks, lunch and as needed.
 - d. Eye Protection Safety Glasses or Face shield
- 2. Visual Screening Supplies & Best Practices:
 - a. Individually wrapped Disposable Mirrors
 - b. Penlight & Blacklight It is not necessary to wipe down the lights between children with disinfectants since they should be kept clean during the visual only BSS screening process. Plus, the lights are not designed to withstand the moisture, which can lead to battery corrosion and early replacement.
- 3. Hand Sanitizer & Disinfecting Wipes
- 4. Toothbrushes to remove gross debris from occlusal surfaces as needed.
- 5. Toothpicks to lightly "feel" occlusal surface for sealants as needed.
- 6. Oral Health Kits

Office Supplies:

- 1. Smile Survey Name Tag
- Rolling Cart
- 3. Pens, pencils, paper clips etc.
- 4. Cell Phone, Tablet, or Laptop for electronic data entry
- 5. Access to Smartsheet via link in Toolkit, Smartsheet app on phone or tablet, or through smartsheet.com
- 6. Data entry forms (<u>School</u>), (<u>Child</u>) saved to favorites of your preferred device or copy of QR codes available in toolkit to scan
- 7. WA State Screening Forms as needed, for back-up, in the case of poor Wi-Fi or cell reception
 - a. There is space to document 7 students per form; have enough to do the entire school
- 8. Results Letters
- 9. Extra AA Batteries for Penlight & Blacklight
- 10. Garbage Bags with Pop-up Basket or masking tape to hang from table

Suggestions (Not required):

- 1. Use a tote box to hold screening supplies on the table.
- 2. Paper towels, dental bibs or clean sheets of paper to use as a screening supply surface per class.
- 3. If you have a small/medium folding table available at home, you may want to bring it just in case since most of the tables in elementary school hallways are reserved for small group (math or reading) education during the school day.
